

The Further Mathematics Support Programme

Supporting students with problem solving for university applications

A one day course focusing on the development of problem-solving skills in year 12 students and preparation strategies for the MAT and TMUA examinations.

This course will be of interest to any teachers who are interested in developing the deeper mathematical problem-solving skills in their students that are necessary for success in university admissions examinations.

The focus for this will be the Mathematics Admissions Test (MAT) and the Test of Mathematics for University Admissions (TMUA) examinations but the course will include materials suitable for use in general classes.

Course Outline

Aims:

- To give information about the MAT and TMUA examinations themselves.
- To provide teachers with an opportunity to think about, discuss and hear others' experiences of supporting students to develop their problem-solving skills.
- To give teachers' time to work on problems themselves in order to gain insight into the challenges of supporting students to develop these skills.
- To introduce teachers to useful resources to use with students and advice on how to set up problem-solving support in their own school/college.
- To provide information about organisations that support students in preparing for the MAT and TMUA examinations.
